2018 EBERLE ESTATE CHARDONNAY

Asian and Anjou pear aromas meet with Key lime, citrus and gardenia on the vibrant nose of this bottling. The palate is both tart and lush, with flavors of green guava and white flowers driving it along.

2018 EBERLE ZINFANDEL

Sourced from three vineyards, this bright, elegantly structured red shows brambly wild flowers, plum preserves and white pepper. Extracted and juicy.

2017 EBERLE VINEYARD SELECTION CABERNET SAUVIGNON

PASO ROBLES

Roasted blackberry and toasted brioche aromas make for a cohesive mix of smoke and fruit on the nose of this bottling. The texture on the palate is engaging, with just enough tannins and acidity to hold up those seared berry, dried pepper and cracked pepper flavors. ~ MK

2018 EBERLE CÔTES-DU-RÔBLES, PASO ROBLES

Winemaker Chris Eberle (no relationship to Gary Eberle!) claims 2018 as his favorite vintage and this is certainly our favorite for this iteration of a tribute to a Côtes-du-Rhône. The blend of 63% Grenache, 30% Syrah and 7% Mourvèdre is exciting and bright. White pepper makes its mark on pomegranate and wild strawberry. Violets and roses bloom out of the glass thanks to a lively acidity. Bien fait!

2019 EBERLE CÔTES-DU-RÔBLES BLANC

This marvelous blend of 43% Grenache Blanc, 43% Roussanne, and 14% Viognier, sourced from three vineyard sites, as aged sur lie in French oak. Aromas of buttered pears and pineapple are sumptuous scents, followed by white flowers that permeate nose and palate. The arrangement of minerality, floral, tropical fruit and summer apricot are superbly orchestrated.

2017 EBERLE SYRAH STEINBECK VINEYARD

Lively and zesty, yet well-structured, offering blueberry, savory herb and smoked pepper flavors that take on elegance toward refined tannins. Drink now through 2025. 1,486 cases made.
